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GENERAL

(GENERAL INTRODUCTION AND PROGRAMME RATIONAL)

Tribes are group of people having distinct language, culture, lifestyle and socio-economic condition and are living in a specific geographical area. Normally, the tribes reside in interior forests, remote and inaccessible areas or in the outskirts of forests and hilly regions. According to Article 180 of the Constitution, the Scheduled Tribes are the tribes or tribal communities or part of groups within these tribes and tribal communities, which have been declared as such by the President through a public notification. As per the 2011 Census, the Schedule Tribes account for 104.3 million representing 8.6 percent of the country's population. The tribes are characterized by distinct cultures, shyness of contact with other communities at large and economical backwardness.

Immediately after independence, Governments both at National and State level have given priority and importance for the development and welfare of the tribes and this s resulted in improving the living conditions of the tribes across the nation. Illiteracy, unemployment, poverty and its related syndromes have forced the tribes to alienate themselves from the mainstream.

The tribes who are residing in the remote corners of the nation are not having first hand information about what is happening elsewhere in the country. If the student and youth communities are getting sufficient information and opportunities to interact with their peer groups in other parts of the nation, the extremist activities among them can be curtailed. In this context, it is proposed that, the tribal youth should be positively engaged and educated and for that; Tribal Youth Exchange Programmes is of great help.

Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan organizes Tribal Youth Exchange Programme for the development of tribal youth with the support of Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India. **Thirteen Tribal Youth Exchange Programmes** have so far been organized by Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan since 2006 in collaboration of Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India.

As per the minutes of project Approval Committee (PAC) meeting held on 05.07.2022 under the chairmanship of Additional Secretary (LWE), it was decided to organize 26 programmes under 14th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme during the year 2022-2023 for which 5,200 selected tribal youth from worst affected blocks of 25 LWE districts from the States of Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh & Bihar. The venues are Central Delhi (Delhi), Shimla (Himachal Pradesh), Ahmedabad (Gujarat), Bangalore (Karnataka), **Mysore** (Karnataka), Mumbai (Maharashtra), Chandigarh, Amritsar (Punjab), Panchkula (Haryana), Kochi (Kerala), Puducherry, Coimbatore (Tamil Nadu), Vadodara (Gujarat), Lucknow (Uttar Pradesh), Varanasi (Uttar Pradesh), Kolkata (West Bengal), Hyderabad (Telangana), Vishakhapatnam (Andhra Pradesh), Alipur (Delhi), Jaipur (Rajasthan), Bhopal (Madhya Pradesh), Indore (Madhya Pradesh), Bhubaneswar (Odisha), Guwahati (Assam), Jammu (Jammu & Kashmir) and Margao (South Goa). During the current year, the programme will be organized in phases. In fourth phase, the programme is planned to organize at Nine venues viz. Guwahati (Assam), Jaipur (Rajasthan), Mumbai (Maharashtra), Hyderabad (Telangana), Amritsar (Punjab), Shimla (Himachal Pradesh), Indore (Madhya Pradesh), Coimbatore (Tamil Nadu) and Jammu (Jammu & Kashmir) respectively.

AIMS & OBJECTIVES

- To raise aspirations of youth from remote tribal areas of worst affected blocks of 25 selected districts of 08 states of the country and provide them opportunity to visit to 26 different places of the country to understand the cultural ethos, language, lifestyles of the people, Socio-economic & Cultural Development, Process and unity in diversity aspect of our national life.
- To Expose them with the technological/industrial advancement, skill development, education and employment opportunities available there and disseminate awareness regarding various developmental/welfare schemes.
- To sensitize the tribal youth about their rich traditional & cultural heritage and enable them to preserve it for the future generation.
- To help the tribal youth to develop emotional linkages with their peer groups in other part of the country and enhance their self-esteem.
- To provide opportunities to the participants for interactions with Constitutional Authorities such as Hon'ble President of India, Vice President, Governors & Members of council of Ministers, great achievers, sports personalities, Film/TV Stars, other VIPs, Local Communities, Panchayati Raj Institutions and the youth affiliated with the NYKS Youth Clubs so as to understand development issues, seek guidance for their involvement development process.
- To develop personality of the tribal youth by enhancing their understanding of life skills, and related training needs, fulfilment of their legitimate career aspirations through Employable Skills, Awareness Generation on existing schemes of both State and Central Govt. in respect of development of Tribal Youth, and by providing them necessary guidance and career counselling.

CONCEPT AND METHODOLOGY

The underlying concept of Tribal Youth Exchange Programme is based on interactive pattern, learning through sharing, exposure visits and showcasing the best practices of development process and scientific and technological advancement. It is expected that such template will trigger curiosity among participating tribal youth and they therefore may try to become part of mainstream development process. Besides, they may after departure to their native place leverage their knowledge and wisdom among their fraternity and peer group.

Methodology:

In the financial year, NYKS therefore proposed to organise 14thTribal Youth Exchange Programmes at **Twenty-Six venues** with the participation of 5,200 tribal youth (@ 200 youth at each venue) drawn from 25 worst affected LWE blocks (as provided by MHA as Annexure- A). The venues proposed are Central Delhi (Delhi), Shimla (Himachal Pradesh), Ahmedabad (Gujarat), Bangalore (Karnataka), Mysore (Karnataka), Mumbai (Maharashtra), Chandigarh, Amritsar (Punjab), Panchkula (Haryana), Kochi (Kerala), Puducherry, Coimbatore (Tamil Nadu), Vadodara (Gujarat), Lucknow (Uttar Pradesh), Varanasi (Uttar Pradesh), Kolkata (West Bengal), Hyderabad (Telangana), Vishakhapatnam (Andhra Pradesh), Alipur (Delhi), Jaipur (Rajasthan), Bhopal (Madhya Pradesh), Indore (Madhya Pradesh), Bhubaneswar (Odisha), Guwahati (Assam), Jammu (Jammu & Kashmir) and Margao (South Goa).

During the current year, the programme will be organized in phases. In fourth phase, the programme is planned to organize at Nine venues viz. Guwahati (Assam), Jaipur (Rajasthan), Mumbai (Maharashtra), Hyderabad (Telangana), Amritsar (Punjab), Shimla (Himachal Pradesh), Indore (Madhya Pradesh), Coimbatore (Tamil Nadu) and Jammu (Jammu & Kashmir) respectively.

As and when, the funds are received for other phases, accordingly information will be conveyed to the concerned SDs for needful at their level.

The programme will be organized by the concerned State Directors, NYKS with the support of concerned DYOs of NYKs. Sufficient number of the participants will be selected by NYKS and CAPFs to factor in last minute drop out of the participants.

Precaution: While undertaking the designated activities, the participating youth should wear face mask, wash their hands on regular intervals, due care for personnel hygiene and maintenance of social distancing as well as while following the advisories and Guidelines issued by the Government and District Administration. Further, as per local notifications, permissions for conducting activities may be sought from District Administration.

• From the selected 25 districts (selected by Ministry of Home Affairs, GOI) on an average, 10-40 tribal youth (per district in 50:50 male: female ratio) in the age group of 18-22 years along with 02 official escorts (01 male & 01 female) should be invited at each programme location (venues) from the states of Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh & Bihar. Youth from vulnerable Tribal Groups will be included in the selection of tribal youth on priority.

- The representatives of Panchayati Raj Institutions will also be included within the total no. of participants and age relaxation may be given to them, if necessary.
- During the 07 days Tribal Youth Exchange Programme, Seminar, Discussion, Lecture series, Talk by Experts, Cultural Programme, Exposure visit to Industry, Career Guidance, Exposure to ongoing sports events will be organized. Apart from that, participants will also visit places of historical and cultural importance of the host states. Interactive sessions with constitutional authorities, dignitaries and eminent personalities will add values to this programme. Tentative Time schedule is given at **Annexure-1** and format for plan of implementation is given at **Annexure-1** (i). Suggestive Programme Schedule is given at **Annexure-2** and suggestive daily routine for the 14th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme is given at **Annexure-3**.

BROAD STATISTICS

The tribal population of the country, as per 2011 census, is 10.43 crore, constituting 8.6% of the total population. 89.97% of them live in rural areas and 10.03% in urban areas. The decadal population growth of the Tribal from 2001 to 2011 has been 23.66% against the 17.69% of the entire population.

Tribals constitute a large percentage of population in Left Wing Extremism affected areas. As per data of Ministry of Home Affairs on state wise extent of LWE violence (during 2014-18), 4347 incidents took place in which 1149 deaths were recorded. In 2014, 1091 incidents took place in which 318 deaths were recorded. In 2015, 1089 incidents took place in which 230 deaths were recorded. During 2016, 1048 incidents took place in which 278 deaths were recorded. In 2017, 908 incidents took place in which 263 deaths were recorded. During the year 2018 (upto 15.03.18) 211 incidents took place with 68 deaths recorded.

From the above analysis, it is evident that LWE poses gravest challenges to national security. The physical and demographic spread of the problem, nature and degree of disillusionment reflects an unenviable reality, which requires sincere, unified and focused attention of every element of the government machinery to neutralise the hardline fringe Maoist element and simultaneously, bring inclusive development in the affected areas.

There are 106 districts covered from 10 states viz. Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal under SRE (Security Related Expenditure) to LWE affected states by the Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India to address the issues and there are 35 worst LWE affected districts among LWE districts.

The 14th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme proposed selection of 5,200 participants (male & female) from LWE affected blocks of 25 districts during the year 2022-23 from the states of Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh & Bihar.

BENEFICIARIES AT EACH LEVEL AND THEIR INVOLVEMENT

As decided in the meeting on 05.07.2021, under the chairmanship of Additional Secretary (LWE), Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India, the participants for the 14th TYEP will be identified from interior areas of the tribal belts of the participating States viz. Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Telangana and Bihar. Youth from Vulnerable Tribal Groups will be included in the selection of tribal youth, on priority.

The number of tribal youth participants will be drawn from the following interior parts of most LWE affected blocks of 25 districts (list enclosed at 'Annexure- A') to participate in the 14th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme at Twenty-Six (26) venues as per the following details:

Details of Participation of Stakeholder Departments/Agencies

Selection of Districts from where the participants will be selected:

From the most affected blocks of 25 LWE districts (list provided by MHA, GOI) on an average, 10-40 tribal youth, (per district in 50:50 male: female ratio) in the age group of 18 to 22 years along with 02 official escorts (01 male & 01 female) will be invited at each programme location (venues) from the states of Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Bihar. It has been decided that the Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs) viz. CRPF, BSF, ITBP, SSB will get all the selected participants medically examined (Blood Test, Haemoglobin test, BP etc.) before the finalization of their name for the camp. Also, selection should be done mainly from tribals, landless and other vulnerable sections of society in remote and inaccessible areas of the LWE affected districts and specifically from the list of LWE affected Blocks enclosed at "Annexure A". Participants from District Headquarters and other developed parts of the districts should not be considered for the selection.

Agency wise selection of Tribal Youth:

Selection of participants should be done by Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs viz. BSF, SSB, ITBP, CRPF) and NYKS from the list of most LWE affected Blocks of selected districts (as provided by MHA and attached at "Annexure- A").

Selection of Districts from where the participants will be selected:

From the most affected blocks of 25 LWE districts (list provided by MHA, GOI) on an average, 10-40 tribal youth, (per district in 50:50 male: female ratio) in the age group of 18 to 22 years along with 02 official escorts (01 male & 01 female) should be invited at each programme location (venues) from the states of Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Bihar. It has been decided that the Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs) viz. CRPF, BSF, ITBP, SSB should get all the selected participants medically examined (Blood Test, Haemoglobin test, BP etc.) before the finalization of their name for the camp. Also, selection should be done mainly from tribals, landless and other vulnerable sections of society in remote and inaccessible areas of the LWE affected districts and specifically from the list of LWE affected Blocks enclosed at "Annexure A". Participants from District Headquarters and other developed parts of the districts should not be considered for the selection.

Agency wise selection of Tribal Youth:

Selection of participants should be done by Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs viz. BSF, SSB, ITBP, CRPF) and NYKS from the list of most LWE affected Blocks of selected districts (as provided by MHA and attached at "Annexure- A").

• **BSF**: 290 tribal youth participants should be selected by the BSF from interior areas of Kanker district, Chhattisgarh and 334 tribal youth should be selected from Malkangiri districts of Odisha. **Total participants-624**

- **SSB:** 312 Tribal youth participants from Bihar State should be selected by SSB from Jamui and Gaya districts (205 tribal youth participants from Jamui and 107 from Gaya district). **Total Participants-312**
- ITBP: 442 tribal youth participants should be selected by ITBP from Narayanpur district and Rajnandgaon district of Chhattisgarh (234 tribal youth from Narayanpur and 208 participants from Rajnandgaon district). Total participants- 442
- CRPF: 454 tribal youth participants from 4 districts of Chhattisgarh i.e. 78 each from Bastar and Dantewada, 138 from Bijapur&160 participants from Sukma district of Chhattisgarh should be selected by the CRPF. 210 Tribal Youth from each of 5 district of Giridih, Gumla, Khunti, West Singhbhum, Saraikella- Kharsawan), 170 Tribal Youth from the district of Latehar, 160 Tribal Youth from Chatra, 240 Tribal Youth from Lohardaga district of Jharkhand (Total-1,620), 160 tribal youth participants from Balaghat district of Madhya Pradesh; 160 participants from Lakhisarai district of Bihar, 104 participants from Vishakhapatnam (Rural) district of Andhra Pradesh, 110 Participants from Bhadradri- Kothagudem district of Telangana and 330 Participants from Gadchiroli district of Maharashtra, 130 participants each from Kandhmal and Kalahandi (Total-260) district of Odisha should be selected by CRPF. Total participants-3,198
- NYKS: 156 tribal youth participants from Bastar, Bijapur, Dantewada district of Chhattisgarh, 156 participants from Narayanpur and Sukma district of Chhattisgarh and 104 participants from Rajnandgaon district of Chhattisgarh, 78 participants from Vishakhapatnam district of Andhra Pradesh, 78 participants from Bhadradri-Kothagudem district of Telangana, and 52 participants from Gaya district of Bihar should be selected by the NYKS. Total participants-624.

Strategy for Implementation

- Care **must be taken not to allow person** who already participated in Tribal Youth Exchange Programmes (TYEPs) organized earlier. The idea is to ensure participation of tribal youth from the most interior parts of the LWE affected areas.
- While priority is to be given to the tribals from interior areas, some non-tribals may also be considered as participants for better communication and exchange of ideas not only within the group but also with the outsiders.
- One Member from NYKS should accompany with the CAPFs personnel while selecting the participants.
- District's Superintendent of Police (S. P.) should be consulted for selection of youth. A certificate regarding consultation with District S.P. is to be enclosed.
- As per the recent mandate of Govt. of India regarding implementation of Schemes, a certificate by Gazetted Officer regarding physical inspection during every programme should be provided.
- All such programmes which are interactive in nature should be organized with the aim to engage and encourage the youth. Lecture should be avoided during the programme.

- Interaction should be in language understandable to the youth. NYKS and CAPFs should also ensure presence of an interpreter in the Escort team, who is conversant with native language of the Tribal Youth as few participants may need the same.
- The district wise list of participants along with filled in **Application form** (**Annexure-4**) and indemnity Bond selected by BSF, ITBP, SSB & CRPF must be communicated to concerned District Youth Officer and concerned State Director at State level.
- All the participants should be required to fill up the **Indemnity Bond** before participating in the programme (**Annexure-5**).
- All the participants should be required to submit the Medical Fitness Certificate signed by Medical Officer before participating in the programme. Proforma is given at **Annexure-6.**
- The **list of selected participant** should be as per **Annexure-7**.
- The participants will be issued proper ID cards by the concerned Youth Officer before they start their journey for the programme. The **sample ID card** is given at **Annexure-8**.
- Contact details of District Youth Officers and State Nodal Officer of NYKS, CRPF, SSB, ITBP and BSF for this purpose is attached herewith at **Annexure-9**.
- Reporting format for activities and programmes including competition is given at **Annexure-12.**
- Details of No. of Participants and No. of escorts from NYKS, BSF, ITBP, SSB and CRPF have been tabulated State wise, District Wise and Venue Wise (**Annexure-13**).
- All the participants will carry with them passport size photograph. They should also carry proof of their present academic qualifications and Vocational Skills acquired or skills traditionally possessed by them.
- Details of no. of participants from NYKS, BSF, ITBP, SSB and CRPF have been prepared State, District and Venue Wise (Table-1) and given at **page no.** 7. The concerned District Youth Officer must also ensure to select the participants from the blocks of above mentioned districts given at "Annexure A" as provided by MHA.
- Apart from that, all the selected tribal youth should carry with them a set of their traditional dresses and costumes for cultural performances during 14th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme. However, it may please be noted that cultural performance is not the only criteria for selection of the tribal youth. PRI members should also be included as participants for 14th TYEP as mentioned on previous pages.
- The concerned District Youth Officers of the selected districts of Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh & Bihar should immediately start the selection of tribal youth in collaboration with CAPFs which should be compiled by the respective State Director of the State and accordingly, advance list of participants should be communicated by email to State Director as well as to the NYKS HQ for onward submission to MHA.
- The concerned State Director should coordinate and be in touch with DG-Media from Ministry of Home Affairs in respect of ensuring wider media coverage of the programme.
- The concerned State Director/ DYO should also invite Senior officers of CAPFs in and around the touring place to host the touring party for at least one session.
- A **de-briefing session** should be organized at the end of every tour programme when participants return to their respective place, there should be de-briefing session of participants at the Blocks/ district level in presence of Commissioner/Deputy

- Commissioner/DM. During this, representatives of CAPFs, NYKS and other senior officials of the district should also participate. Adequate media coverage of the programme both print, electronic and on social media should be ensured.
- DYOs are advised to utilise the funds under each head as per the laid down criteria ensuring codal formality as given in GFR and with due transparency and fiscal prudence.

**The Concerned State Director of host and participating State should ensure to submit Audited Utilisation Certificate within 10 days from the completion of the programme to RD office. While submitting the Audited UC from Regional Office to HQ, Regional Director must verify and reconcile the unspent balance reflected in the Audited UC; if any.

Buzz Creation and Programme Build- up through Social Media Campaign

- Host State and district NYK must ensure that in the run-up to the Tribal Youth Exchange Programme (TYEP), massive buzz creation activities should be taken to make NYKS India trending on social media platforms such as Facebook, Twitter and Instagram.
- The Host as well as participating district NYKs should ensure extensive publicity through E-posters/infographics on the programme and the same should be shared on the official handles of NYKS.
- The Host District NYKs should re-post/retweet the infographics tagging NYKS India and using the hashtag #14thTYEP and #tribalyouth.
- Pictures of various activities of the programme undertaken/short videos on TYEP programme may be shared daily by the DYOs and volunteers on district NYK's social media platforms by tagging NYKS India and using hashtag #14thTYEPand #tribalyouth.
- Both the participating and host district NYKS should seek views/opinions on TYEP activities from Celebrity/Youth icons, Messages from People's Representatives, and Individuals of eminence etc. and the same be made trending under the hashtag #14thTYEP #tribalyouth.
- The host State NYKS should monitor the TYEP programme and ensure that best of programs and relevant IEC is highlighted through social media handles of State NYKS.
- Apart from the above activities, State Director should also coordinate and be in touch with DG-Media from the Ministry of Home Affairs for wider publicity and media coverage of the programme.
- District Youth Officer of Host District as well as participating District should also submit the Social Media Report in the enclosed performa along with **Annexure-11** given below:

Target Population:

Mainly Tribals, landless and other vulnerable sections of society from the remote and inaccessible areas of the LWE affected blocks of selected districts are the target beneficiaries/participants under this programme.

Selection of Escorts for the participants:

Selection of Escorts for the participants- (<u>The budget will not be provided for TA/DA, Boarding & Lodging and Insurance separately for the escorts. Since there is no provision of separate budget for escorts, so escorts are selected amongst the participants.)</u>

- In order to ensure successful implementation of the programme CRPF, ITBP, SSB, NYKS and BSF should deploy 02 Official Escorts (One Male & One female) each for a batch of approximately 20 tribal youth contingent from a district for entire duration of the programme. Total Number of Escorts is 520 for 25 districts as per the **page no. 7**. No budget has been allocated for the escorts. The details of Agency wise & District wise number of Escorts are given at Annexure-10
- Orientation of Escorts The escorts must be oriented about the programme and their duties in escorting the participants before the commencement of the outward journey by CRPF, ITBP, SSB, NYKS & BSF respectively. This is most important.

Comprehensive Insurance of the participants

All the participants must be insured with a Govt. Insurance Agency by the concerned District Youth Officer, Nehru Yuva Kendra for a period during which the participants will be travelling as well as participating in the programme.

Track Suit, Thermal inners, T-shirts, Cap, Socks and Sports Shoes

Concerned State Director/DYOs, NYK of the programme venue should ensure providing good quality apparel i.e. Track Suit, Thermal inners, T-shirts, Cap, two pairs of Socks and one pair of Sports Shoes to the participants with prominently depicting logo of NYKS and name of programme.

Venue and Dates of the Programme:

For organization of 14thTribal Youth Exchange Programme, State Directors of the respective states will finalize the dates, duration and venue of the programme immediately after receiving the guidelines from NYKS Hqrs. Each venue will host 200 participants along with 20 Escorts.

Medical facilities for the Participants:

One medical officer should be deployed by the concerned State Director/DYO to take care the medical problems of participants at each of 26 programme venues. During travel of participants CAPFs should provide medical assistance to participants.

Roles of Stakeholders: The following roles and responsibilities for the stakeholders during the programme are proposed as under: -

CRPF: CRPF should mobilize and select about 78-160 participants each from the four districts of Chattisgarh (total 454), and 160 participants from Lakhisarai district of Bihar (total 160) and 160-240 participants from each of the 8 districts of Jharkhand (total 1,620) and 104 participants from Vishakhapatnam district of Andhra Pradesh (total 104), 110 Participants from Bhadradri- Kothagudem district of Telangana (total 110), 330 Participants from Gadchiroli district of Maharashtra (Total-330) and 130 participants each from Kandhmal and Kalahandi district of Odisha (Total 260) and 160 participants from Balaghat district of Madhya Pradesh (total- 160). Total participants to be selected by **CRPF** is 3,198. CRPF should share the list of participants with DYOs of NYKs of the 4 districts of Chattisgarh, 8 districts of Jharkhand, Vishakhapatnam district of Andhra Pradesh, Lakhisarai district of Bihar, Bhadradri- Kothagudem district of Telangana, Balaghat district of Madhya Pradesh, Kandhmal & Kalahandi district of Odisha and Gadchiroli district of Maharashtra with filled in application of the selected candidates along with filed in Indemnity Bond. CRPF should also hand over the selected participants to DYOs of NYKs districts for participating in the 14th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme. The list of the selected candidates should be given by CRPF to concerned DYOs of NYKs under intimation to concerned State Directors, NYKS. The list of NYKS officials are at **Annexure-7**.

For the successful implementation of the programme and ensuring the safety of the participants, it is proposed that the CRPF should select and deploy 2 Escorts (1 Male and 1 Female) for a batch of 20 participants for each participating districts for escorting the participants from the time of departure till arrival back from the programme place to home district. **Total escorts to be selected by CRPF is 320.**

• **BSF:** BSF should mobilise and select 290 participants from interior areas of Kanker district of Chhattisgarh and 334 tribal youth participants from Malkangiri districts of Odisha. **BSF should select a total of 624 participants**. BSF should share the details with DYOs of NYK, Kanker & Malkangiri district of Chhattisgarh & Odisha respectively with filled in application of the selected candidates along with filed in Indemnity Bond. BSF should also hand over the selected participants to DYO of NYK, Kanker (Chhattisgarh) and Malkangiri (Odisha) district for participating in the 14th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme. The list of the selected candidates should be given by BSF to concerned DYOs of NYKs under intimation to the concerned State Directors of NYKS. The list of NYKS officials are at **Annexure-7**.

For the successful implementation of the programme and ensuring the safety of participants, it is proposed that the BSF should select and deploy 2 Escorts (1 Male and 1 Female) for a batch of 20 participants for each participating districts for escorting the participants from the time of departure till arrival back from the programme place to home district. **Total escorts to be selected by BSF is 62.**

 SSB: SSB should mobilise and select 312tribal youth participants (205participants from Jamui and 107 participants from Gaya districts of Bihar State with filled in application of the selected candidates along with filed in Indemnity Bond. **Total 312 participants** should be selected by SSB. SSB should also hand over the selected participants to DYO of NYK, Jamui and Gaya (Bihar) for participating in the 14th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme. The list of the selected candidates should be given by SSB to concerned DYOs of NYKs under intimation to the concerned State Directors of NYKS. The list of NYKS officials are at **Annexure-7**.

For the successful implementation of the programme and ensuring the safety of participants, it is proposed that the SSB should select and deploy 2 Escorts (1 Male and 1 Female) for a batch of 20 participants for each participating districts for escorting the participants from the time of departure till arrival back from the programme place to home district. **Total escorts to be selected by SSB is 32.**

• ITBP: ITBP should mobilise 234tribal youth participants each from Narayanpur district and 208 tribal youth participants from Rajnandgaon districts of Chhattisgarh (Total participants is 442) and share the details with DYOs of NYK, Narayanpur and Rajnandgaon, with filled in application of the selected candidates along with filed in Indemnity Bond. ITBP should also hand over the selected participants to DYO of NYK, Narayanpur and Rajnandgaon (Chhattisgarh) for participating in the 14th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme. The list of the selected candidates should be given by ITBP to concerned DYOs of NYKs under intimation to the concerned State Directors of NYKS. The list of NYKS officials are at Annexure-7.

For the successful implementation of the programme and ensuring the safety of participants, it is proposed that the ITBP should select and deploy 2 Escorts (1 Male and 1 Female) for a batch of 20 participants for each participating districts for escorting the participants from the time of departure till arrival back from the programme place to home district. **Total escorts to be selected by ITBP is 44.**

NYKS: NYKs should mobilise and select 52 tribal youth participants each from Bastar, Bijapur, Dantewada (total- 156) districts of Chhattisgarh, 78 participants from Narayanpur and Sukma district of Chhattisgarh (total 156) and 104 participants from Rajnandgaon district of Chhattisgarh, 78 participants from Vishakhapatnam district of Andhra Pradesh, 78 participants from Bhadradri- Kothagudem district of Telangana, and 52 participants from Gaya district of Bihar should be selected by the NYKS (Total Participants-624). The DYOs should also get the filled in application of the selected candidates along with filed in Indemnity Bond. Before the departure of the participants to various venues in the country for the 14th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme all the participants and Escort Officers should be thoroughly briefed and oriented about the programme by the concerned District Youth Officer of NYK. The participants should also be informed about their roles and responsibilities and they should also be introduced to each other and also with the escorts. The DYO will issue I-Cards and arrange insurance cover for all participants and escorts. DYO will also make travel arrangements like booking of reserved tickets and payment of Journey DA to the participants and escorting officer under supervision of the concerned State Director.

For the successful implementation of the programme and ensuring the safety of participants, it is proposed that the NYKS should select and deploy 2 Escorts (1 Male and

1 Female) for a batch of 20 participants for each participating districts for escorting the participants from the time of departure till arrival back from the programme place to home district. **Total escorts to be selected by NYKS is 62.**

The budget for the escorts will not be provided for TA/DA, Boarding & Lodging and Insurance separately. Since there is no provision of separate budget for escorts.

Before the departure of the participants to various venues across the country for the 14th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme, all the participants and Escort Officers should be thoroughly briefed and oriented about the programme by the concerned District Youth Officer of NYK. The participants should also be briefed about their roles and responsibilities and they should also be got introduced with each other as well as with the escorts. The DYO should issue I-Cards and arrange insurance cover for all participants. DYO should also make travel arrangements like booking of reserved tickets and payment of Journey DA to the participants under supervision of the concerned State Director.

Reporting: - Within 15 days of completion of the programme the concerned State Directors/DYO, NYKs must submit the detailed report of 14thTYEP on the reporting formats as per Annexure no. 11, 12 and 17 along with Social Media Report as per performa given at Page 11. Whereas Audited Utilisation Certificate should be submitted in 10 days to NYKS Hqtrs.

NEW ACTIVITIES INCLUDED IN THE 14THTYEP

- Special session of briefing/Orientation (before the departure of the tribal youth) and debriefing (after arrival of participants at their concerned District HQ) will be organised in presence of Commissioner/DM/DC/ SP and CAPF officers and NYKs officials by ensuring extensive media coverage.
- Lecture/Discussion/Expert talks should be organised on Jangal, Jal, Jameen.
- Exposure visit to Big Industries/Corporate Sectors/Production Assembly Units/Vocational Institutions
- Visit to ongoing Major Sporting Events.
- **Interactive Session:** Only Constitutional Authorities, senior government functionaries, exceptional achievers in different fields (Sports, industry, art etc.), other role models will be invited to interact with the youth.
- The concerned State Director/ DYO should also invite Senior officers of CAPFs in and around the touring place to host the touring party for at least one session.
- Framed Group Photographs with eminent personalities.
- After selection of the participants by CRPF/BSF/SSB/ITBP and NYKS, participants will be provided with details of programmes and activities for their information and knowledge.
- De-briefing session will be held at the end of every tour programme at the Blocks, where the participants belonged to. Participation of both officials of CAPF, NYKS and DM/DC/SP of the district should be ensured, Besides, proper media coverage is to be ensured during such programme.

AWARENESS ON NATIONAL FLAGSHIP PROGRAMME OF GOVT. OF INDIA FOR FINANCIAL AND SOCIAL INCLUSION

IMPORTANT POINTS TO BE NOTED BY ALL STAKEHOLDERS FOR SUCCESSFUL IMPLEMENTATION OF 14THTRIBAL YOUTH EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

- Participants must carry their own warm clothes i.e. Sweater, Muffler, Cap etc. because of winter season.
- Good Standard to be maintained for Boarding/lodging and other facilities for the participants. Bed should be provided to all participants during their stay in the camp.
- Good quality Apparels (Track Suit, Thermal inners, T-shirts, Cap, socks, Shoes)/ kits should be procured for the participants across all the programmes.
- Short duration lecture Sessions should be organised for the participants and it should be designed in such a manner so that youth took active participation
- The participants may be encouraged to visit ongoing major Sporting Events and Big Industrial Production centres/ Assembly Units/Vocational Institutions.
- Interactive Session with Constitutional Authorities such as President, Vice President, Governors, CM, Members of Council of Ministers of Union/State Govt., senior government functionaries, exceptional achievers in different fields (sports, industry, arts etc.), other role models should be invited for the session with the participants.
- A framed Group Photograph of participants with constitutional authorities which may be given to each of the participants after completion of the programme.
- Due diligence should be applied while selecting the participants so that there are no drop outs. Only those participants should be selected who are enthusiastic, pro-active and eager to participate in the programme. This may considerably minimize the dropouts.
- Youth from vulnerable Tribal Groups should be given priority at the time of selection of participants for TYEP.
- The participants should be from rural background and from remote and inaccessible areas of the LWE affected blocks of selected districts.
- The participants should possess sound health.

- Easy process may be adopted in selection of participants.
- Cultural performers may also be included in the list of participants.
- Special Briefing session of participants by DYOs about the programme is to be undertaken at the end of every tour programme at the Blocks, where the participants belong to. Participation of CAPF officers, NYKS officers and DM/DC/SP of the city will be ensured. Proper media coverage of such programme should also be ensured.
- Reservation of Train journey tickets of participants should be done at least 1 month in advance and once tickets are reserved it should be ensured that there are no drop outs. It must be ensured that the reservation of participants should be made in the train where there is provision for pantry car.
- Joint briefing by CAPFs should be done before handing over to NYKS and on return journey of the participants, CRPF/BSF/SSB/ITBP should receive the participants and prepare Action Plan for follow up measures while organizing such programmes in future.
- Deployment of Escorts may be made with proper seriousness, to avoid drop-outs.
- Exposure to participants to Industry and Skill Development programme for their perspective development on employment and entrepreneurship, Apparel Industry, Automobiles, Thermal Power, Bulb Factory, Telephone Exchange and Mobile Manufacturing Company may be taken up for such visit.
- Sharing of IEC materials and literature on various schemes of both Centre & States Govt. in respect of tribals may also be provided to them.
- Efforts should be made to maximize the involvement of female participants and the ratio should of Male/Female should be maintained at 50:50 as far as possible.
- The detailed programme should be chalked out by the concerned SD & DYO along with resource persons.
- Interaction of participants of Tribal Youth Exchange Programme with school students should be made a regular feature and to be included in all future programmes.
- VIPs invited in the programme may be requested to keep their speeches precise & short.
- Health Status of all the participants would need to be checked by the Doctors, available with CAPF before leaving from the Headquarter. For this, Security Forces Hospitals in each district should undertake health check-up in respect of all the participants from that districts during selection.
- District Administration may also be associated in the activities of 14th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme.
- The date of the programme may be decided in such a way that the period of school exams, Major Festivals and Crop harvesting seasons are not affected.
- Concerned State Director of the host State should coordinate and be in touch with the DG- Media of Ministry of Home Affairs and share the tour programmes and debriefing ceremonies highlight for publicity and wider coverage of the programme.
- More interactive session should be conducted.
- Feedback from the participants to be taken by NYKS as well as CAPFs and acted upon at every stage of the programme.

Note: While organising the programme, Government advisories and other protocols regarding COVID- 19 issued by Central Govt and respective State Govts. Should be strictly adhered.

BRIEFING OF THE PARTICIPANTS- BEFORE DEPARTURE OF THE PARTICIPANTS

It is important to note that the participating NYKS Kendras/States jointly with CRPF, BSF, ITBP, and SSB would organize special session of briefing/Orientation (before the departure of the participants) and de-briefing (after the arrival of participants at their concerned District HQ) in the presence of Commissioner/DM/DC/SP and CAPF officers and NYKS officials by ensuring **extensive media coverage**.

During the session activity and their plan of action for the participants be prepared and followed up. The report on the same & plan of action be submitted to NYKS, HQ.

The host NYKS Kendra/State should conduct two sessions viz. expectations of participants (Annexure 14 a) and feedback about programme (Annexure-14 b) from participants.

1. Briefing of the participants before attending the programme.

- After selection of the participants by CRPF/BSF/SSB/ITBP and NYKS; the
 participants should be provided with details of programme and activities for their
 information and knowledge and will be briefed about the programme.
- Participants will be briefed thoroughly by DYO, NYK along with escorts on the eve
 of their departure to programme venue. Purpose of this session would be to
 provide opportunities to the participants to conceptualize and internalize the
 motive of TYEP programme.
- Briefing of participants about the programme is essential to be done prior to attending the programme by DYOs of respective participating NYKs and CRPF/ ITBP/BSF/SSB.

2. Debriefing of the participants on their return back to Home town.

officers of NYKS, CRPF, BSF, SSB and ITBP would endeavour to follow up the programme with the participants of the 14th Tribal Youth Exchange. One-day debriefing session would be organized) in the presence of Commissioner/DM/DC/SP and CAPF officers and NYKS officials by ensuring extensive media coverage for this purpose.

- The concerned officers should orient the participants and develop social action initiative involving larger youth population of the district for the development of Tribal Youth and mainstreaming them with the development programme at State and National Level. The concerned SDs and DYOs should coordinate with State line department for developing Action Plan for mainstreaming tribal youth in the process of developments
- They will also ensure the sharing of experience of the participants who attended the 14thTribal Youth Exchange Programme.

EXPECTATIONS AND FEEDBACK OF PARTICIPANTS BY HOST KENDRA/STATE RESPECTIVELY ON FIRST AND LAST DAY OF PROGRAMME

- a. Written Feedback: Questionnaire for assessment of expectation of the participants from the programme on their arrival at programme venue and feedback of the participants about the programme while departure from programme venue have been provided at Annexure 14 (a & b) respectively. The concerned State Director will give the dedicated responsibility to one of the District Youth Officer of the State for getting both the feedbacks (on Arrival, on Departure) filled up by all participants. The compiled report and analysis of the feedback form received from all the participants should be enclosed with the detailed report of the programme at each venue.
- b. Live Video interactions/Feedback: -In order to have live feedback from participants; Interactive Session with participants about their expectations from the programme on their arrival and feedback about the programme on their departure should positively be organised. Videography of both the session is mandatory which should be submitted to NYKS, HQ with the detailed report.

Note: Both during the time of initial briefing/sensitization and de-briefing, the concerned District Youth Officer should request the commissioner or concerned Deputy Commissioner/ District Magistrate to preside over the function. Further, during the meeting, officials of both CAPFs and NYKS may also be called. Besides, proper media coverage and adequate publicity should be ensured during briefing, sensitization and debriefings.

EXPECTED OUTCOME

- The 14th Tribal Youth Exchange Programme 2022-23 will be an inventive step as well as a well thought out intervention for providing exposure to tribal youth of naxalite affected states about lifestyle, social and cultural norms of visited places of the mainland.
- The programmes will help in sensitizing the tribes about the rich and traditional cultural heritage of the tribal communities and enable them to preserve it for the future generation.
- The programme will also help the tribal youth to develop emotional linkages with their peer groups in other part of the country.
- The programme will provide windows or interfaces to break social and cultural isolation and directly help to instil feelings of kinship across mainstream India.
- The programme will strive to inculcate the message of Sadbhavana, Peace, Development and Solidarity among the tribal youth for displaying the cultural variety, uniqueness and integrity of the country.
- The Tribal Youths will be given Information and Knowledge on National Integration, Patriotism & Nation Building, Skill Development, Communal Harmony, Indian Constitution, Democracy, Rights and duties of Citizens, Disaster preparedness & Management, Language Learning & Women Empowerment.
- The participants will be able to share and appreciate each other's traditional and cultural heritage as well as development in different spheres of life.
- The programme will provide opportunity to the participants for interaction with Constitutional Authorities such as Hon'ble President of India, Vice President, Governors & Members of Council of Ministers, Exceptional Achievers (in the field of Sports, industry, arts), other role models, the Local Communities, Panchayati Raj Institutions and the youth affiliated with the NYKS Youth Clubs so as to develop emotional and cultural ties with the youth placed in similar life situation in different parts of the country. This will also provide platform to the participants to interact with each other and share their experiences for mutual benefit.
- The participants will be given exposure to Industry & Skill Development, Important Enterprise, Corporate Sectors, places of Historical and Tourist importance which may facilitate the provision of employment to them.
- The programme will also provide opportunity for tribal youth to enhance entrepreneurial skills, understand innovative business models for their self-employment and hospitality related skill development and management.
- The programme will facilitate tribal youth to actively participate in national development and join the mainstream development process on sustainable basis.
